The reality of it is that the more weight you cut, the weaker you really are. Once you're at a comfortable weight, that's where you're strong, which is what I should have done last year instead of sucking so much weight.



Remembering Jack Lloyd



May 20, 1935 ~ December 29,2022

Jack Lloyd took over the band program at Stadium in 1966. During his 34 years there, the band won countless awards. They traveled to Europe in 1972 and 1977, with trumpet virtuoso Rafael Mendez as a guest soloist. They were Washington State's representative at the National Bicentennial Celebration in Philadelphia/Washington D.C. in 1987 and traveled to Moscow and St. Petersburg, Russia in 1993, and also Australia in 1996. In addition to his work at Stadium. Jack taught at Grant and Lowell Elementary schools and conducted at the University of Puget Sound and the Puget Sound Music Society. He was honored by the National Band Association in 1980, receiving its Citation of Excellence Award and was inducted into the Washington Music Educators Hall of Fame in 2002. He retired in 2000 from Stadium, but remained active for many years in community affairs and was an honorary member of the Tacoma Kiwanis Club.
